- Church Programs

- Local Police picked him up for 15 years.
- "It cost us a million dollars not to do something about Murray."

## The Circuit: A Great Cost To The Community

- CBJ & State Prison Costs: \$53 & \$93/day
- Bartlett Regional Hospital Costs per visit?
- Rainforest Recovery Costs per pick-up?
- CBJ & Downtown Business Association Maintenance & Clean-up Costs?

Who are the homeless chronic inebriates and what are their needs?

- Glory Hole: Approximately 30 known homeless chronic alcoholics/frequent fliers.
- Bartlett/Rainforest: Approximately 10 or so.
- Police Department & Corrections:
